24:10 it's the same you know we are not free 24:13 of the same 24:13 pressures that um netflix disney plus 24:17 paramount 24:18 plus and all those streaming services 24:20 have as well so 24:21 there is exclusive content because 24:22 that's how um some platform sells their 24:26 their viability is is by having that 24:28 exclusive content you know i i 24:29 personally think 24:30 that the library use is 24:33 a different animal than the purchase use 24:37 which is essentially what you're getting 24:39 from audible you know i know they have a 24:40 subscription services 24:41 you know but i think it's a little bit 24:43 of a different animal 24:44 just like purchased ebooks from amazon 24:46 every uh most of the ebooks that we 24:48 have are available in that way so no i 24:51 don't hear about it 24:52 um i'm happy to talk about it but i 24:55 don't get a lot of complaints about that 24:56 i think people 24:57 are the heavy users of audiobooks are 25:00 getting to the point where they're 25:01 saying oh 25:02 okay it's not because the library didn't 25:04 purchase this obviously if it's a big 25:06 you know if it's a b list author or up 25:08 we pretty much are going to have it 25:10 someone's going to have it in the system 25:11 you know and and um we're likely going 25:14 to have it as well 25:16 and some of them are just not available 25:17 and that's where you know we have those 25:19

physical 25:21 audiobooks we can get essentially 25:22 everything on cd 25:25 but people can't play them many people 25:27 can't play a physical cd if i hand a 25:29 physical to cdc to someone that doesn't 25:30 fit in that car 25:32 you know um what are you gonna have a 25:33 bluetooth cd player that plays into the 25:35 car it's uh ridiculous so 25:37 um this is a thing that we are gonna 25:39 have to deal with and it's not just 25:40 audiobooks but it also happens with 25:42 ebooks sometimes as well 25:43 so um more common with audio those other 25:46 formats 25:46 um it just i think there's something 25:48 about if you remember there was a there 25:51 was a push to have kindle 25:53 screen read ebooks and that started to 25:56 infringe 25:57 it was good enough that it actually 25:58 started to infringe on the audiobook 26:00 industry and they were concerned about 26:02 that and it really got they got the 26:03 kybash thrown on that right away 26:05 so um because that's the licensing for 26:07 audio 26:08 books is a whole different um ecosystem 26:11 SO 26:14 i just stumbled on one the other day and 26:16 was like again 26:18 probably maybe the third one i've come . 26:20 across 26:22 it's weird i mean you can send it to us 26:25 and we can try to see if it's available 26:26 in some way but uh you know you would 26:28 you would normally see it if it said

26:30 oh do you if you search for an overdrive 26:32 it would say you know you want to 26:33 recommend this title to 26:34 request a library so yeah well not an 26:37 overdrive 26:38 you have the ebook you just don't have 26:41 the audio and it's not even offered as 26:43 an audio so that's 26:45 that's kind of the key of oh it must be 26:48 an audible book 26:49 уер уер 26:53 it doesn't make us happy we're not 26:54 pleased by this but this is 26:56 uh this is the trade-off when we leave 26:58 uh you know a physical and it's it's 27:00 more stark in the video formats right 27:03 um where it's even you know there's no 27:06 way we're gonna have the content that 27:07 disney plus has 27:08 or netflix it's just much of that 27:10 content is just unavailable to us for 27:11 streaming 27:17 any other questions for jeff on the 27:19 director's report 27:20 yes i had a um question jeff or maybe 27:23 even lisa might know the answer to this 27:25 i'm wondering if we have any sense of 27:28 when uh 27:28 uhls might consider reducing that 27:32 72-hour hold 27:34 on our physical collections so actually 27:36 there that's we were going to talk about 27:38 that a little bit later on 27:39 so they've actually the directors have 27:41 recommended a 48-hour 27:44 um a 48-hour quarantine and that you 27:46 know 27:47

31:57 the fund balance some information about 31:58 the fund balance i know that that 32:00 you know it's really a good disclosure 32:02 to have 32:04 um the total fund balance as of 32:07 june 30th of 2020 was 3.3 32:10 million 3.342 and of that 32:15 we need about 1.4 million to fund 32:17 operations for the first four months 32:19 of the of the year and the remaining 32:22 balance which is about 1.9 million 32:25 is designated for capital expenditures 32:28 and building needs 32:30 based on what's decided in the long 32:32 range plan 32:37 i don't know if anybody has any specific 32:39 questions about 32:41 uh you know a particular line item 32:44 or just the format uh 32:48 happy to answer anything that i can 32.52 i wanted to just ask one question 32:55 this is the same format we've used for a 32:58 number of years 32:59 and what strikes me this year and i 33:02 don't have a suggested change but i want 33:03 to point 33:04 out to people under the income section 33:07 typically 33:08 there is very little it's very um 33:11 static there's there's really no change 33:12 in like interest income or fines or 33:14 anything 33:15 in in normal times right now 33:19 you're going to have um i'm not sure 33:22 whether we want to try to fit in 33.23 footnotes or something because we are 33:25 projecting less for interest and fines 33:30

42:38 at what point do you announce who's 42:40 running if if there is someone who's 42:41 running 42:42 um or joining a harmeet on the ballot so 42:45 we'll get that 42:46 kristen we'll talk quieter i don't 42:48 actually have the exact dates but i 42:50 think it's um 42:51 april 19th that that week in the 42:54 that's when they uh are due to the clerk 42:57 then she does a drawing 42:58 and then that's when the the names 43:00 become available to us 43:02 thank you and then i work really quickly 43:06 to get the 43:07 the candidate profiles together from 43:10 there 43:14 okay great so you want to talk about 43:16 phrase reopening 43:17 jeff yeah this is uh so this is the 43:19 other big discussion we have tonight 43:21 right so 43:21 um you know we have a phase reopening 43:Ź3 plan uh 43:25 in that we are tied uh to a couple 43:27 different things the the 43:29 the thing that i'm grouchy that we don't 43:30 have yet um beyond grouchy actually i'm 43:32 not i'm far more than crouchy about the 43:34 fact that uh 43:35 library employees have not been moved 43:37 into either the current phase or we 43:39 haven't moved to the next phase 43:40 where library employees would be 43:42 available eligible for the vaccine 43.45 but um and that is certainly mentioned 43:47 in our pandemic response plan but also 43:49

mentioned our you know coordination with 43:51 the other 43:51 uhls libraries and overall infection 43:54 rates in albany county which have been 43:56 steadily going down 43:57 so our neighboring libraries are 44:00 beginning to 44:02 invoke their phases of reopening albany 44:05 public most notably they have a very uh . 44:07 tightly 44:09 tied they're tightly tied to the 44:11 infection rate in the 44:12 in albany county and they are moving 44:15 very quickly 44:16 to begin to reopen their branches as 44:18 they as that number continues to go down 44:20 thankfully that's what that's what we 44:22 want is uh you know as a continuous 44:23 decreasing number 44:25 um i had thought i talked with mark and 44:27 michelle earlier as we were sending the 44:29 agenda for the meeting we had a 44:30 discussion about 44:31 um you know what a possible date might 44:34 be and 44:35 right now it seems like the 22nd 44:38 of march might be that monday might be a 44:42 a reasonable day to begin reopening i 44:44 would recommend 44:46 at that point that we would restart over 44:49 at the limit of 10 people at a time 44:51 we'll keep that 44:52 pretty tightly limited the infection 44:53 rate is still higher 44:55 than i'm happy with it's um certainly 44:57 lower than it has been but it's not as 44:59 low as it was when we reopened last time 45:02 in september so we're not back down

45:04 there but we are 45:05 lower certainly than when we closed in 45:08 december 45:09 so the the numbers are significantly 45:11 lower than that 45:13 according to the you know the new york 45:14 forward website and the albany county 45:16 covet dashboard so 45:18 um i was saying to mark and michelle 45:20 what i wish i could do is rip van winkle 45:22 for the next four weeks i'd love to go 45:23 to sleep and wake up and have it be 45:25 early april when i think this decision 45:27 would be a whole lot easier 45:29 but um i think we can do this in a safe 45:32 way 45:33 giving us a couple weeks from tonight to 45:35 be able to get that implemented we have 45:37 some changes to the building inside that 45:38 i have to undo 45.40as far as staff is concerned and we are 45:41 spreading staff out in order to reduce 45:44 staff density 45:45 we were using much of the available 45:47 floor space that is previously used by 45:49 patrons 45:50 for staff people during that peak when 45:52 we were having 45:53 really a difficult time in december and 45:55 january even fielding a team 45:57 because people were out um under either 46:00 under actual quarantine or under 46:02 quarantine because of a member of their 46:03 family so 46:05 um you know we have to 46:08 clean out some of our make some of our 46:10 back of house actually back of house and 46:11

not front of house again so we need a 46:12 little bit of time to do that 46:14 and and just get ready and prepared to 46:15 do that so um 46:17 you know in addition that gives us a 46:18 little bit of time in case there's you 46:20 know something goes 46:21 horrifically wrong in the next couple 46:22 weeks and also playing for time 46:25 um hopefully new york will move into a 46:28 phase . 46:29 uh we've received relative confirmation 46:32 that library employees are going to be 46:34 in the same phase as forward facing 46:36 retail 46:37 as i talk to a number of patrons i'm 46:39 beginning to get calls from 46:41 reasoned and reasonable people who are 46:42 just wondering about what our plans are 46:44 for reopening and 46:45 as i talk to them all very 46:48 very good and very lovely conversations 46:50 i'm having with members of the public 46:52 you know many of them are surprised to 46:53 learn that the library staff are not 46:55 already 46:56 eligible for um for the vaccine so 47:00 i'm here to tell you that they are not 47:01 but there are across certain counties 47:03 all of us connected to county they were 47:05 onondaga county suffolk and a couple of 47:07 other counties around the state library 47:08 staffs were deemed essential by their 47:10 county so we haven't 47:11 yet had that happen yet i've contacted 47:14 some of our friends across the street at 47:16 the town 47:17 our emergency management director and

47:20 you know we're going to try to to make 47:22 our case and see if we can 47:23 get some movement at the county at this 47:25 point i'll be completely honest i don't 47:26 have a lot of 47:28 hope that that motion and that pressure 47:31 might yield fruit before we just 47:33 get to the phase where it's there be 47:35 eligible as forward-facing retail anyway 47:37 so that's where we are 47:41 uh at the same time as michelle 47:43 mentioned earlier we were talking about 47:45 quarantining items 47:46 um we're currently you know upper hudson 47:48 moved to 72 we were continuing the 96 47:51 right now upper hudson is recommending 47:53 um the directors association sorry 47:56 the reopening the reopening committee of 47:58 the directors association has vote has 48:00 proposed and the directors have approved 48:03 a 48-hour uh quarantined item quarantine 48:06 time for items 48:07 and i think i hate observational data 48:10 when we haven't been running a really 48:11 scientific study 48:12 but we haven't seen a lot of surface 48:15 infection i think the 48:16 you know we're not going to get the 48:17 definitive answer that i would love to 48:19 have 48:20 but i think the preponderance of the 48:21 evidence begins to the point to the fact 48:23 that surface transmission of this virus 48:25 is just 48:26 not the primary mode of transmission i 48:28 think everybody 48:30 uh is um not everybody almost everybody 48:33

has agreed 48:34 that it's the person-to-person um air 48:36 transmission of this virus 48:38 uh not so much under normal 48:40 circumstances or circumstances that you 48:42 might find in the library 48:43 um with the surface contamination so um 48:46 at the same time uh probably this week i 48:49 would like to move 48:50 uh to a 48-hour quarantine that will 48:53 help us just with a little bit of 48:54 materials handling 48:55 at the same time so 48:58 thoughts yeah i had a couple of things 49:01 um 49:02 first of all i support what you're um 49:04 recommending 49:06 as far as going to the browsing i assume 49:09 that you're talking about the same 49:12 policy as before no sitting down no 49:15 working on the computer 49:16 it's just walking and browsing okay yep 49:19 уер 49:19 um to the extent that there was anything 49:23 that caused staff angst like people and 49:26 their masks and stuff 49:28 if um if we could consider maybe 49:30 increasing signage bigger signs more 49:33 blatant signs 49:34 i'm just throwing that out as a 49:36 possibility okay . 49:38 the last thought and i'm not suggesting 49:40 this but i can see it possibly coming up 49:43 down the road 49:44 is um we're starting to hear about you 49:46 know what people that are vaccinated 49:48 can do yes and so i'm 49:52 contemplating whether you're going to

49:54 start getting questions well it's 10 49:56 people but i've been vaccinated can't i 49:58 just go in i'm just 49:59 i'm just throwing that out there as a i 50:02 think you'll 50:03 probably hear it sooner yes yes already 50:07 yes already right and that's where uh 50:09 we're in this interesting time i was 50:10 sort of um talking about this today with 50:13 some of the folks in the library 50:15 you know the guidance has come out about 50:16 travel um you know 50:18 if you're you have to be if you're 90 50:20 days out if you're within the 90 days 50:22 out from your second vaccination 50:24 then you don't need to quarantine but 50:26 we're gonna have people that are gonna 50:27 be all the way through their 90 days 50:29 post their second vaccine i mean we have 50:30 people who were 50:31 fully vaccinated december and early 50:33 january they're inching up on that 90 50:35 days now 50:36 and other people who haven't even been 50:37 vaccinated yet and even among the staff 50:39 we have a couple people right so it's 50:41 it's we're in this weird medium time 50:43 where people are going to have certainly 50:44 have some of those expectations 50:46 our expectation i'll just state here and 50:48 we will stay plainly and everybody comes 50:50 in 50:50 there is a mass mandate by the state and 50:53 by the cdc 50:54 there is a mass mandate in our library 50.56 it will maintain uh it will be in effect 50:59 um for the foreseeable future until such 51:01

into uh summer reading program right now 53:17 so great uh that's great obviously i 53:19 have no personal interest in that 53:21 no no of course not 53:24 i mean can you use the field uh the 53:27 they often never use the field by town 53:30 hall 53:30 there's a baseball field there but you 53:32 never see baseball on it yeah 53:34 i mean i think you know yeah whatever 53:37 and that in fact there's a uh david 53:40 luven wrote me he said they have a 53:42 mobile stage that they received and 53:45 making that available to us as well that 53:46 just i again i continue to be 53:49 i'm just so heartened by the uh amount 53:51 of collaborate the positive 53:52 collaboration that this is forced 53:54 amongst the libraries and amongst our 53:56 other fellow government entities so 53:57 um yes all of those are open to us and 54:00 um you know we are committed to making 54:02 as much of the 54:03 you know as whatever we can do make it 54:05 work and we certainly had 54:06 yeah we did outdoor programming in the 54:08 winter time so i think you know if it's 54:10 summer 54:10 if people have to wear a coat and that's 54:11 the other thing so as we're um 54:13 you know we're going to be limited to 10 54:15 i'm going to start with 10 and we 54:16 started last time we always dip our toe 54:18 in and we move forward 54:19 as things uh you know work out well this 54:21 has worked really very well for us 54:23 i will be more pleased if we have people 54:25 waiting outside to have them waiting

in addition um there is one of the 58:34 minimum standards which is the number of 58:36 hours the minimum number of hours our 58:37 library was open 58:38 we did not meet the minimum standard for 58:40 that year the division of library 58:42 development has 58:42 said that the libraries are going to be 58:44 punished for not meeting the minimum . 58:46 number of hours 58:47 based on cova that's not something 58:49 they're going to hold us responsible for 58:50 but it is 58:51 the first time i ever checked no to a 58:53 minimum standard 58:54 um we almost made it because we're open 58:56 so many more hours 58:58 then are we required i think we're at 52 59:00 or 54 hours a week we're open 72 hours 59:02 most weeks 59:03 so that three quarters of the year when 59:05 we were open normally we almost got 59:07 there 59:07 where i was able to say yes even though 59:09 we were closed for three months but not 59:10 quite so 59:11 uh there was no way for me to stretch 59:13 that in any sort of reasonably ethical 59:15 manner so 59:16 um the report is there it is a monster 59:20 um but uh tanya is 59:23 uh you know we farm all pieces of this 59:25 out to the to the appropriate folks but 59:27 um we believe these numbers are a fair 59:30 and accurate representation of of 59:32 the financial picture and the 59:33 statistical picture of the library in 59:35 that fiscal year so
